




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Why do this Elderly ?

- Resilient electricity supply

Improvement in the conditions in which we operate




- Integration of a social determinant of health into re-admission pathways
- The most vulnerable are selected by a combination of two datasets

SOCIAL

- Intensive training of front line staff from Elderly and Respiratory wards
- System-wide focus on living well and supporting people to manage their lives in a positive way

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Improvement in the conditions in which we operate



- £335,600 Project investment, raised entirely by the public
- £600,000 Electricity purchase cost saving over the 20 year project life
- **Resilience** against grid price increases

ECONOMIC . f?

- £300,000 Community Fund
 - 100 patient home visits / year; reducing re-admission rates from cold homes
 - Further funding to increase now flowing into project

CHALLENGES AHEAD

Improvement in the conditions in which we operate

CHALLANGES



- 1. Moving at pace, and with multiple partners, in an NHS risk averse environment
- 2. Requiring early buy in from Senior Leadership Team
- 3. Working with clinicians on a none medical model, and integrating this into "normal"
- 4. The Removal of the UK feed in Tariff
