The Challenge is based on three pillars:

- Mitigation Reducing health care's own carbon footprint.
- Resilience Preparing for the impacts of extreme weather and the shifting burden of disease.
- Leadership Educating staff and the public while promoting policies to protect public health from climate change.

The Health Care Climate Challenge currently has 200 participants, representing the interests of more than 18,000 hospitals and health centers in 31 countries.

Collective targets and achievements

Commitments to reduce their carbon emissions by more than 34.2 million metric tons of CO2e.

To date:

- -Reductions of over 6.8 million metric tons of CO2e
- -Financial savings of over 350 million Euros.

Each participant will:

- Sign a pledge to reduce their carbon footprint, become more climate resilient and exert leadership for a healthy climate.
- Establish carbon reduction targets
- Share data on progress over time.
- Compete for Health Care Climate Awards which will recognize leaders globally, by region, and for each of the three pillars.
- Receive an automatic membership in Global Green and Healthy Hospitals and with it, access to member exclusive tools and resources.






